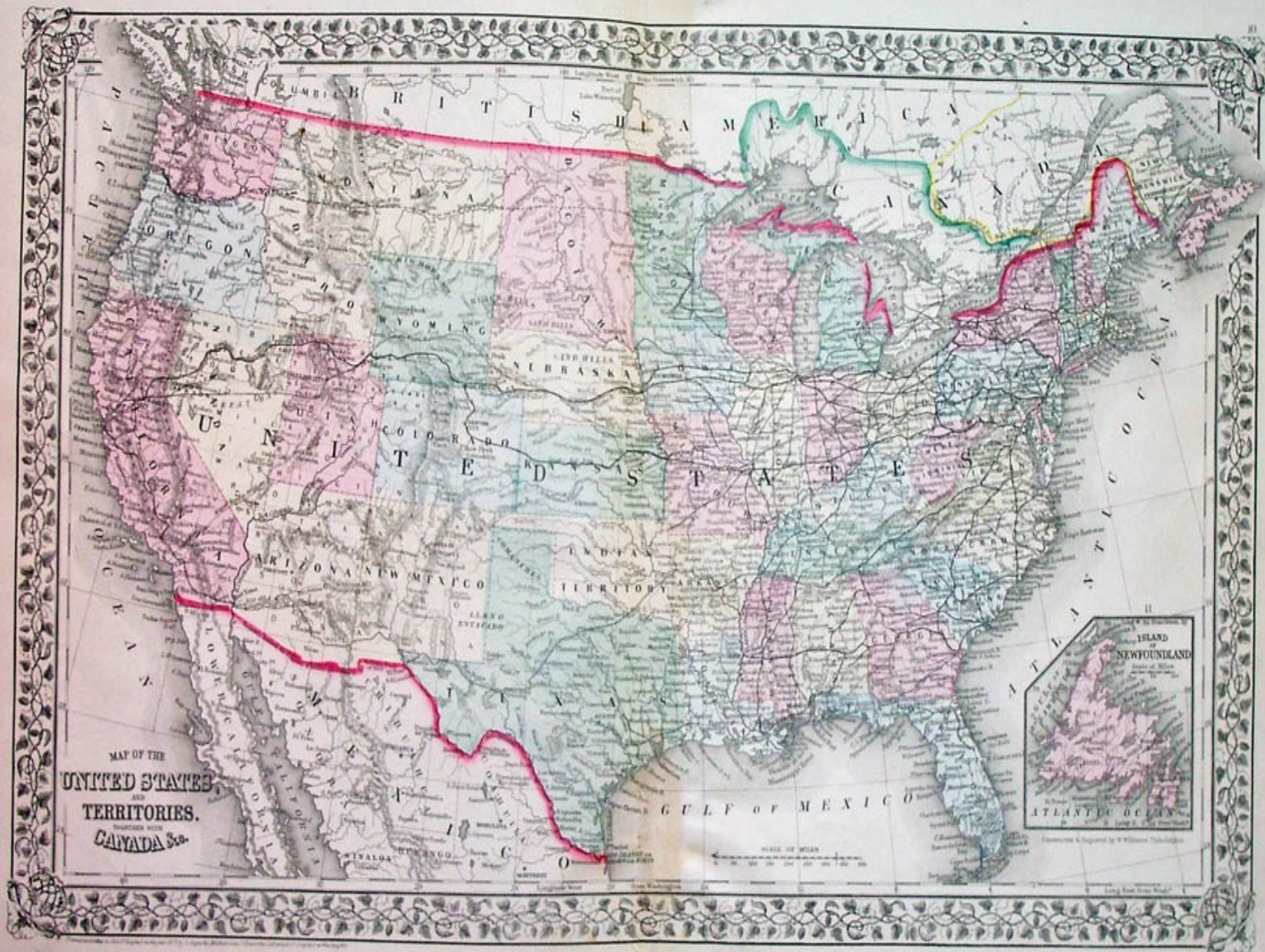

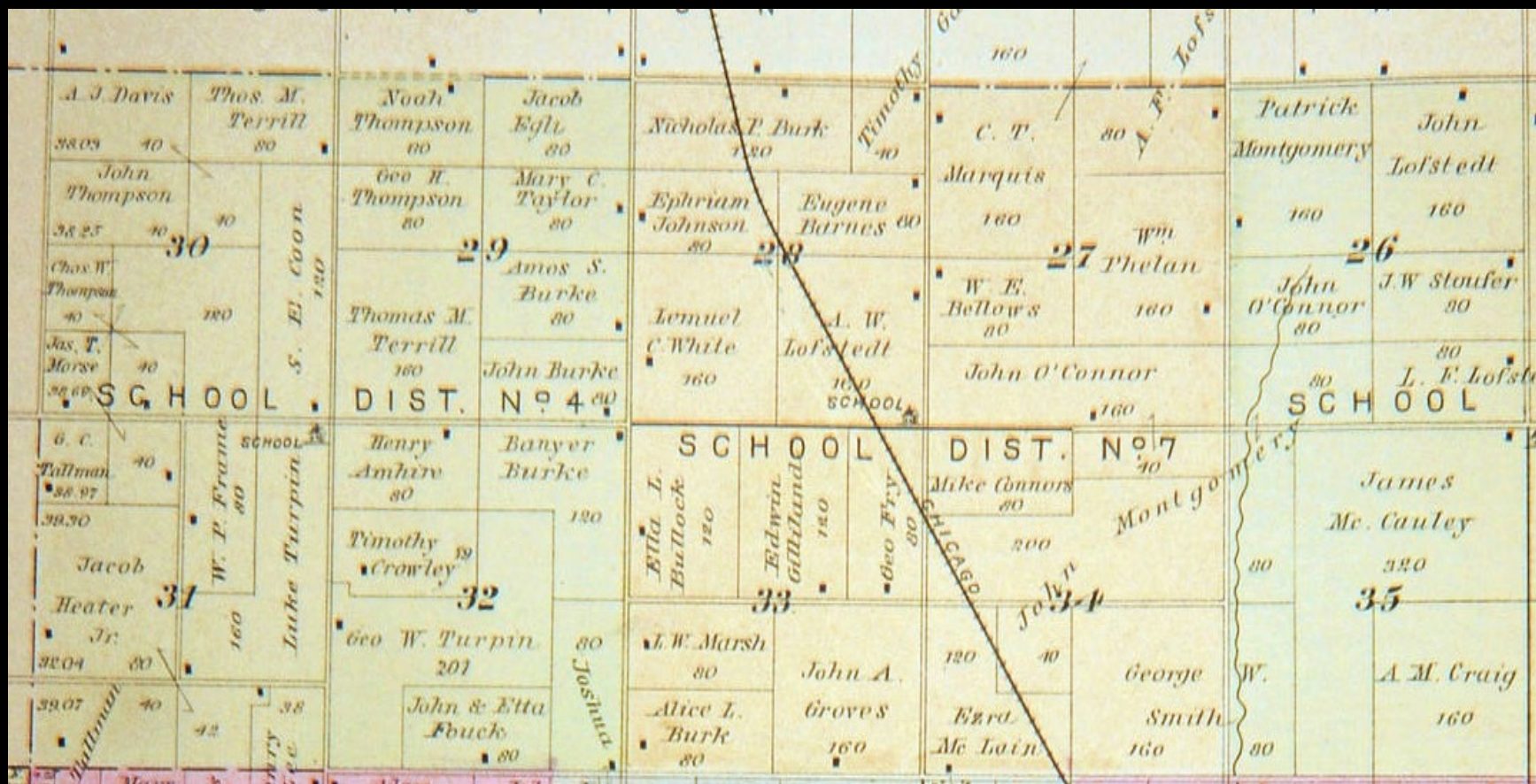

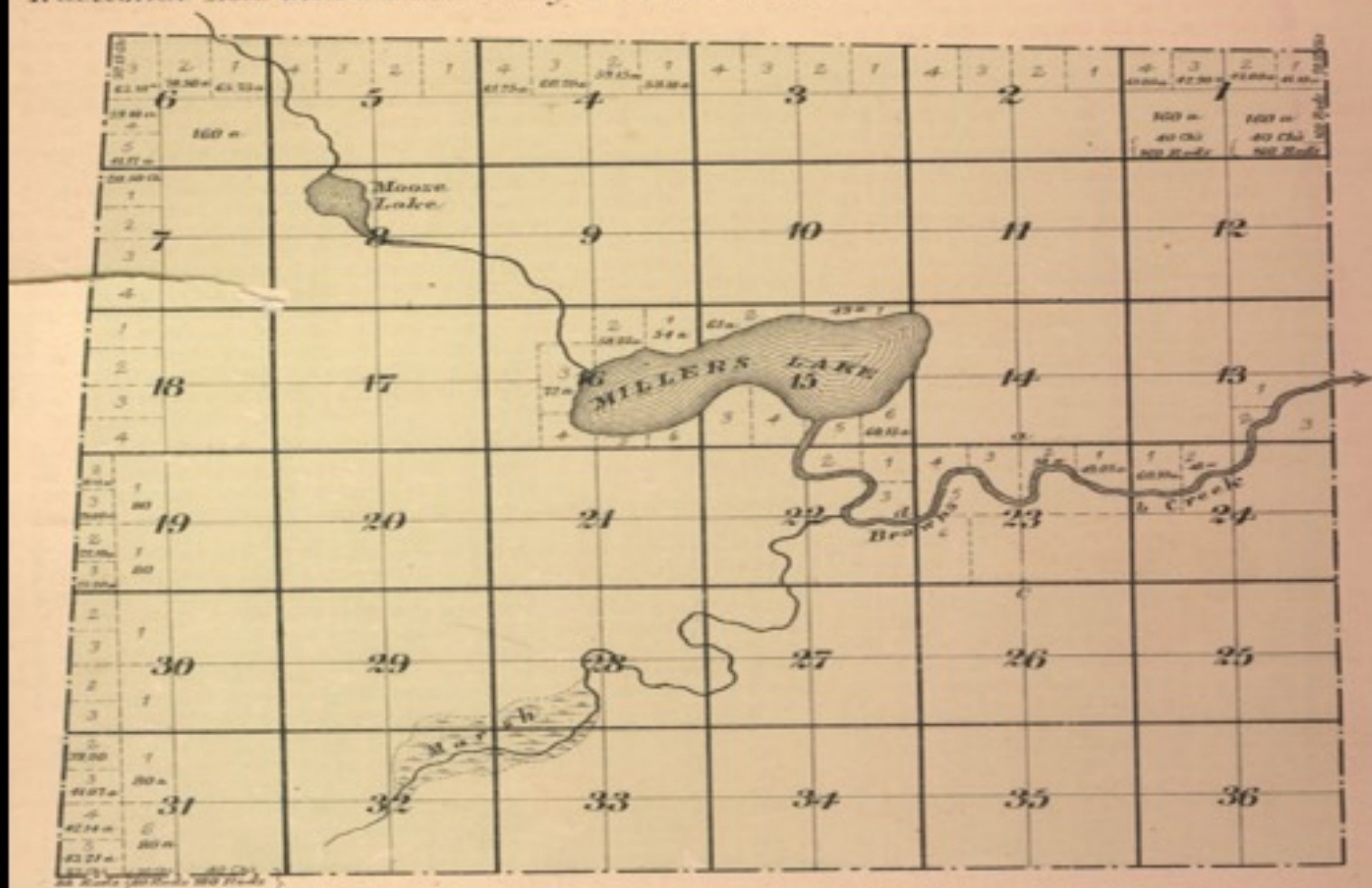

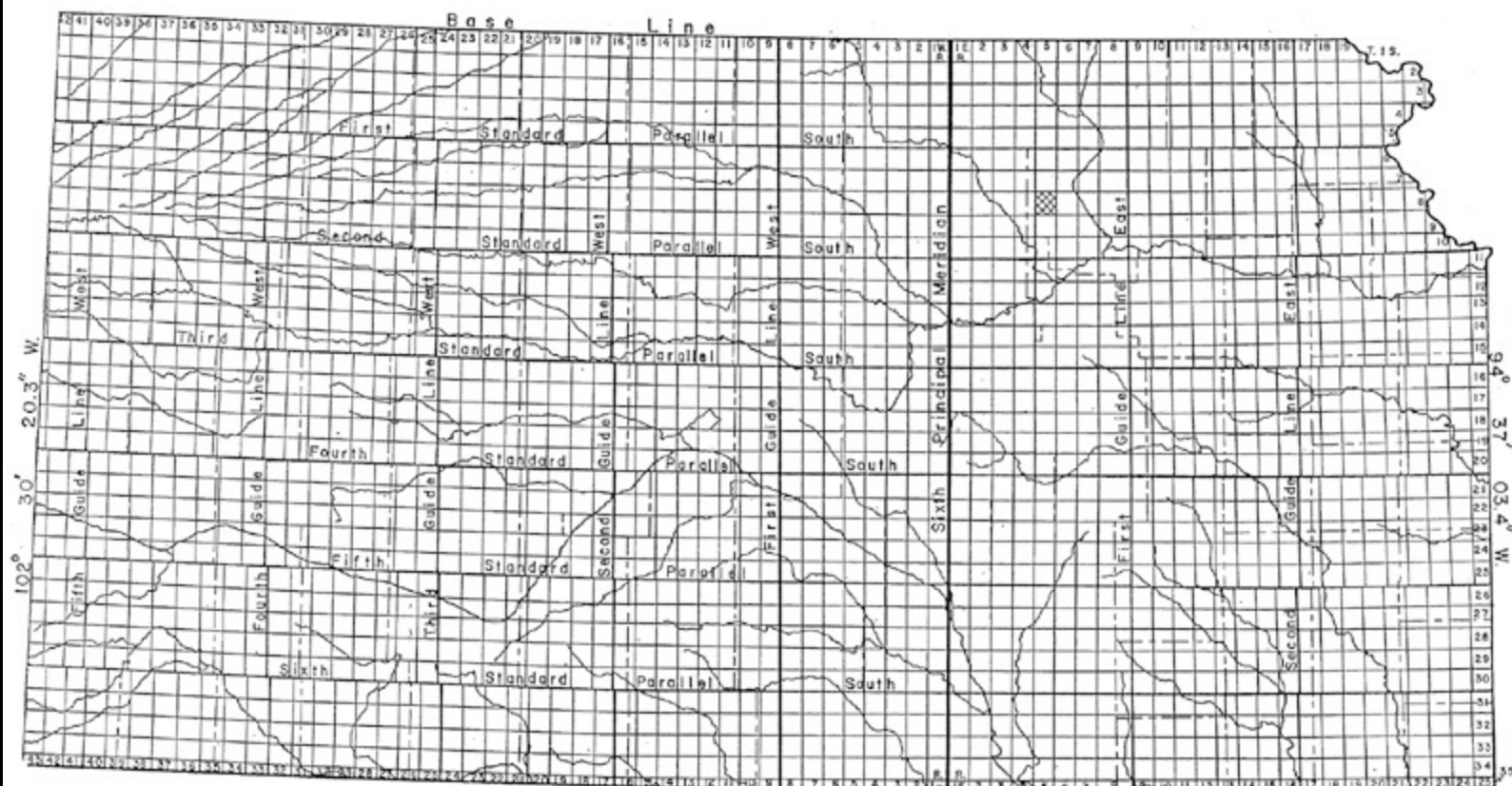

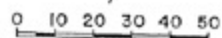

OF FEDERAL SURVEYS IN KANSAS



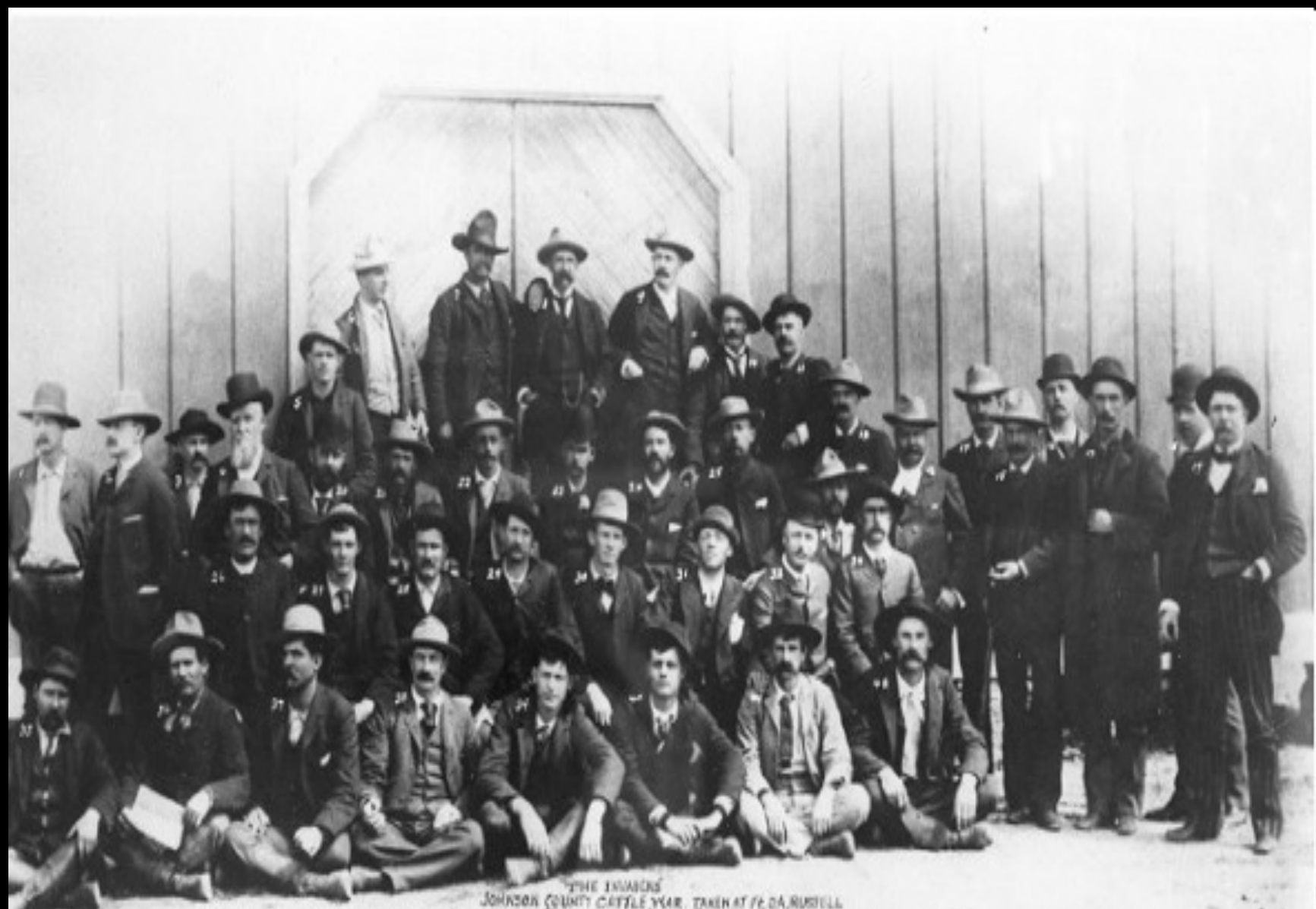
